A Brief History of the FEEFHS Annual Conference

The Salt Lake Plaza Hotel has been the venue for 15 FEEFHS conferences and workshops.

The FEEFHS Annual East European Research Conference has been a cornerstone of FEEFHS for twenty-five years. From the very first meeting in 1992, the FEEFHS founders planned to have an annual conference as one of the major activities of the organization. The first annual convention was announced in October 1993 and held in May 1994 at the Howard Johnson Hotel (now the Plaza Hotel) right next door to the Family History Library in Salt Lake City.

The very next year, the FEEFHS went on the road to Cleveland (1995), followed by Minneapolis (1996). The original plan was to return to Salt Lake City every three years, and so the event was held in Salt Lake City again in 1997.

The 2009 conference in Milwaukee was a joint conference with the Society for German Genealogy in Eastern Europe (SGGEE). FEEFHS also held a western regional conference in 1995 in Calgary, Alberta during the annual convention of the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia (AHSGR).

Since 2010 the conference has been held consistently in Salt Lake City to take advantage of the resources and knowledgeable staff at the Family History Library. For a few years, the conference format changed to a workshop, with morning-only classes and afternoons open for research and individual consultations. In 2013, FEEFHS sponsored a second event, a workshop on finding your immigrant origins. In 2014 the conference format returned to holding classes in both the morning and afternoon along with an offering of several pre-conference workshops.

One of the highlights of the annual conferences is the banquet, featuring a keynote speaker and great door prizes from sponsors and other donors. Luncheons, opening receptions, tours, cultural events, and appointments with consultants have also been a part of FEEFHS conferences over the years.
