The Russian Federal Archies has created a database, "<u>Crimes of the Nazis and their accomplices</u> against the civilian population of the USSR during the Great Patriotic War 1941-1945." This WWII era database documents over 46,000 victims while research continues to add more names. The database is free to access and it is in the Russian language. You can search or browse by name and view scans of original documents related to the fate of these victims.
