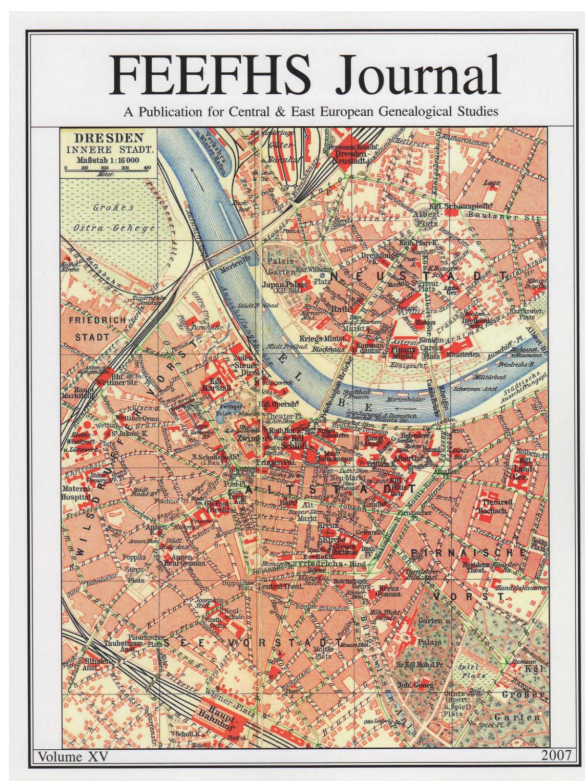
The Forgotten Goldmine of the FEEFHS Journal

- **Tracking specific migration patterns**, like Germans from Russia or regional groups from Galicia and Bukovina.
